The Concept

- **contribute to the involvement of young people in public life**
- **meet the information needs of young people**
- **offer easy access to relevant information**
- **offer access to European and national information**
- **mainly offer links to other information sources rather than provide information directly (“added value”)**
- **increase the awareness of Europe and European issues**
- **include interactive options**
- **involve young people in the preparation and implementation**

Concept and Principles

The principles attributed to information:

- it goes beyond information on programmes and covers very broad areas (such as employment, housing, health etc.)
- it must be equally accessible for all
- it must fulfil high standards of ethical behaviour
- it must be user-friendly
- substance and distribution must involve young people

- **Prototype phase: 15 July - 15 December 2002:**
 - European Consortium for the Content of the European Youth Portal
 - three persons researching and writing for the EYP content
 - the portal will be available in two languages: English and French
 - countries present: member states
- **EYP in 2003**
 - all themes completed
 - information for 30 countries
 - translation into German
- **From 2004...**
 - maintenance
 - translation in 11 languages
